Theatre for everyone

We warmly welcome people with access needs or sensory sensitivities to our shows.

Me & My Shadow features very little spoken language. Our performers will use Auslan to signpost some key moments in the show to ensure d/Deaf people and Auslan users can have an equally enjoyable experience.

The Adelaide Festival Centre accommodates people with access needs and is wheelchair accessible. Check their website for information, the front-of-house team will be available to assist you during your visit.

Here are some other good things to know:

- there are no sudden or very loud sounds in the sound design or music
- low level lighting is used throughout the show to create effects but there are no periods of total darkness
- we take a relaxed approach to audience noise and movement, and children who need a break are welcome to exit and re-enter with guidance from the front-of-house team
- we recommend bringing earmuffs or dark glasses for children who may find the show over-stimulating

ME & MY SHADOW

A guide for children about what
they will see and hear.



Soon, my class and I are going to see a show called *Me & My Shadow*.

It is a live performance in a theatre.

I will sit in my seat and watch the show on stage.

I do not need to join in.

My teachers and classmates will be with me.

Me & My Shadow is a story about a person and their shadow becoming friends.

It is about:

- meeting someone new
- learning how to play together
- solving problems
- sharing joy

The story is gentle and playful.

There are two performers on stage.

They wear everyday clothes, perfect for playing.

Even when something looks surprising, the performers are safe.

They are pretending and enjoying themselves.

In the theatre, there will be a stage. This is where the performers act.

There will be lots of seats. I will sit here with my class and teachers.

There will also be some mats on the floor in front on the stage.

Some children will sit on them.

There are spaces for wheelchairs.

On the stage, I will see:

- two performers who act and tell the story
- large drapes which hang from the ceiling
- paper bags that change into different things
- light and shadow moving and changing size
- colours appearing and disappearing

Light

Some parts of the show are darker so I can see the shadows clearly.

There will be lights in different colours.

If I don't like how the lights feel, I can wear dark glasses or cover my eyes.

Sound

The performers will laugh, say some words, make sounds and use Auslan.

There will be music and sound played through speakers.

Sometimes it will be quiet and calm. Sometimes it will be a little louder.

There will not be any very loud or sudden sounds.

Movement

The performers move their bodies to tell the story.

They run around, play and do special tricks.

I will stay in my seat and watch.

I will stay with my class and sit in my seat.

I can make sounds to show how I feel, like laughing or saying “wow”.

I will also be still and quiet so everyone can hear and see the show.

The show goes for 45 minutes.

If I need help, I can let an adult know.

An adult can assist me to leave the theatre during the show if needed.

When the show finishes, people clap to say thank you.

Some people might even cheer!

I might feel happy, calm or even sad that it is ending. That is ok.

I can express my feelings in the way is comfortable for me.

When we leave, I might:

- talk about my favourite part
- think about the shadows and light
- tell my family about the story

Everyone experiences *Me & My Shadow* in their own way.
